





Just like the real thing, this is the most coveted trophy of the season. The E-RCU Gold Cup Trophy is an actual Gold Cup award that was presented to an unlimited driver to commemorate the event.

Rose Festival RC Regatta (Westmoreland Park, Portland): An official event of the annual Portland Rose Festival, the RC Regatta brings model boating to the attention of many.

Columbia Cup (Lake of Tualatin Commons, Tualatin, Ore.): Recognizing one of the grandest traditions in the sport of hydroplane racing — the real Columbia Cup, which has been run in the Tri-Cities in SE Washington for nearly five decades.

Cascade Cup (Horseshoe Lake, Woodland): First run in 2006 in the spirit of the Seattle-Detroit rivalry that grew from the Gold Cup, and raised the awareness of hydroplane racing in the West, the Cascade Cup is a challenge race, where the winner gets to choose the



site where he or she will defend their trophy the following season. The event is charged with a rivalry between Seattle and Portland, and is raising awareness of ERCU and 1/10-scale hydroplane racing in Portland and SW Washington.

Silver Cup (Lake Tye,

Monroe): The Silver Cup was one of the first major trophies to be offered for unlimited hydroplanes after World War II. Raced in Detroit each year between 1946-61, it was discontinued after driver Bob Hayward was killed in a racing accident. ERCU runs the Silver Cup as a nod to hydroplane history.

Vandenberg Challenge (Twin Lakes, Marysville): This race annually honors former Miss Bardahl crew chief Leo Vandenberg.

President's Cup (Lake Wilderness, Maple Valley): Run on the Potomac River in Washington, D.C., the real President's Cup was an important stop on the unlimited hydroplane circuit from the 1940's up until the 1970's. It's now an important stop on the ERCU circuit every year. This event is always held in conjunction with the annual Maple Valley Days.

Diamond Cup (Cherokee Bay Community Club, Maple Valley): The actual Diamond Cup for unlimited hydroplanes took place at Lake Coeur d'Alene, in Idaho from 1958 to 1968.

Bernie Little Memorial (Bellevue Downtown Park, Bellevue): Honoring Bernie Little, the long-time owner of the Miss Budweiser Racing Team, this race has become ERCU's annual honor to the sport's most successful owner.

Seafair Trophy (Lake Tye, Monroe): This event takes place as close to Seafair weekend as possible, and is ERCU's homage to

the community organization that keeps hydroplane racing in Seattle. **Oregon Emerald** Cup (Lake of Tualatin

The power plant for both classes is a specific electric motor designed for model boating. In order to keep a fair playing field, an AstroFlight cobalt 25 motor. with "five turns" is the only brushed motor design allowed in this club. In 2006, the club tested. and later approved, the use of a brushless motor

- the Himax 3630-1500 - which became the only brushless motor allowed for competition in the club.

Over the last few years, the technology of batteries have greatly improved. Both of our classes are "fueled" with rechargeable batteries mostly either NiMH (Nickel Metal Hydride) or Lithium Polymer (LiPO) styles of batteries.



We normally run a schedule of 14-15 race season, increasing the visibility of the club all around the Pacific Northwest.

Champion Spark Plug Regatta (Fort Borst Park, Centralia): The first race of the season, this race brings back the historic old race that the big boats used to run in Miami.

Stan Sayres Memorial (Cherokee Bay Community Club, Maple Valley): In honor of Stan Savres, the famed owner and sometime driver of the Slo-Mo-Shun hydroplane-racing dynasty. He was a major force in bringing hydroplane racing to Seattle in the 1950's.

Bill Brow Memorial (Twin Lakes Park, Marysville): Sponsored by Seattle Services, this race is held each vear in honor of the late Bill Brow, who was killed in a

What is ERCU?

Electric Radio Controlled Unlimiteds is a group of dedicated hydroplane enthusiasts who have decided to recreate the thrill and excitement of unlimited hydroplane racing in a 1/10-scale electric radio controlled format. We do it because we love the nostalgia of seeing our favorite old hydros once again thundering down the race course.

We currently have more than 50 members – most of

whom live in the Puget Sound area. A few of our members either currently crew on actual unlimited hydroplanes that tour the national circuit, or have at some point in their boat racing "careers". There is a strong connection between E-RCU and the hydroplane and Raceboat Museum in Seattle. Many of our members have donated hundreds of hours - and lots of money — helping to restore the old boats and support the museum.

We are proud to be the largest 1/10-scale fast electric hydroplane club in the world. We strive to foster the ongoing philosophy of a family-oriented and community-friendly hobby. This is an organization where all of our members have an equal voice and compete on an equal level.

"Rules of the Road"

The goal of ERCU is to recreate the excitement of unlimited hydroplane racing in a 1/10-scale format. For instance, a scale paint scheme and lettering is mandatory. A miniature driver with a helmet and life vest must be in the scale cockpit.

All boats are formally registered with the organization's registrar to prevent duplication of boats. For variety sake, only one version of each original hydro is allowed to compete at each regatta. This also prevents confusion during the competition.

We currently race two separate classes of scale hydros: The vintage class is made up of shovel nosed (round bow) unlimiteds that typically ran from the 1950's to the 1960's. The idea is to keep boats of


