They are very good candidates to join your club. The exposure also positions them to better serve their hobby store customers.

Look at this! There is a new section under development for members! Each of us will be able to post our R/C biography and pictures online! Your friends and family will be able to view your bio and projects right from the website!


The Project Section will be bigger and better, and will include archives.
